Immaculate Heart of Mary & Our Lady's Promise

Gatima Day - September 28, 2025 OUR CONSECRATION TO OUR LADY OF FATIMA

On July 13, 1917, Our Lady of Fatima showed the three children a vision of hell. Following that vision, she revealed the following:

"You have seen hell, where the souls of sinners go. It is to save them that God wants to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If you do what I tell you, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace. This war will end, but if men do not refrain from offending God, another and more terrible war will begin. "You have seen hell, where the souls of sinners go. It is to save them that God wants to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If you do what I tell you, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace. This war will end, but if men do not refrain from offending God, another and more terrible war will begin... To prevent this, I shall come to the world to ask that Russia be consecrated to my Immaculate Heart, and I shall ask that on the First Saturday of every month Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins-of the world.

"If my wishes are fulfilled," the Lady continued, "Russia will be converted and there will be peace...But in the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, and she will be converted, and the world will enjoy a period of peace. In Portugal the faith will always be preserved. In the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph." (Fatima in Lucia's own words)

In this message from Our Lady to the children, I would like to draw our attention to a repeated phrase: "In the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph." When we speak of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we are not just referencing a beautiful picture of Mary and her heart surrounded by flowers, nor are we simply discussing crowning a picture or statue of Mary. The Immaculate Heart of Mary refers to the interior life and virtues of the Virgin Mary, emphasizing her purity, love for God, and compassion for humanity. It's a devotional concept that highlights her profound spiritual life, including her joys and sorrows, and her role as the Mother of God. Devotion to her Immaculate Heart finds its roots in the Gospels, in particular Luke 2:19, "And Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart."

In Lucia's third memoirs, she devoted a short chapter entitled: "Jacinta and the Immaculate Heart of Mary." She writes, "A little while before going to hospital, Jacinta said to me, 'It will not be long now before I go to heaven. You will remain here to make known that God wishes to establish in the world devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary...Tell everybody that God grants us graces through the Immaculate Heart of Mary; that people are to ask her for them; and that the Heart of Jesus wants the Immaculate Heart of Mary to be venerated at His side. Tell them also to pray to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for peace since God has entrusted it to her. If I could only put into the hearts of all, the fire that is burning within my own heart, and that makes me love the Hearts of Jesus and Mary so very much."

To see the importance of honoring the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we turn to the words written by Cardinal Ratzinger in his theological commentary on the third secret of Fatima in which he stated, "To be 'devoted' to the Immaculate Heart of Mary means, therefore, to embrace this attitude of heart, which makes the *fiat* – 'your will be done' – the defining center of one's whole life."

MENTAL WELLNESS FOR THE FAITHFUL

Peace be with you. The words from Jesus this weekend can, and should be, a bit scary. "Depart from me..." This might draw up feelings of rejection. However, He calls us to strive, and I would like to invite you to pursue belonging. "And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God." In this passage, and many other places in scripture, God helps us to understand how we, and so many "of every language," belong. We belong to Him. No matter where we come from, we belong. What a powerful and delightful desire and feeling it is to belong. In therapy, we say that "belonging is becoming." As a child who experiences belonging in a cared home of parental love, we, too, can take risks to trust and scale the heights when we know we belong and matter to the One God who loves us. We belong to Him. You belong to Him. Come and see.



MUSIC & LITURGY

THIS WEEKEND AT OUR LADY OF FATIMA MASSES...

Beginning the weekend of September 6 and 7, 2025, Our Lady of Fatima (OLF) will transition to using worship aids as the primary music resource in our pews. OLF is transitioning to worship aids to allow our musicians the ability to travel between Mass times, churches and choirs without the struggle of switching between hymnals that have different lyrics, keyboard accompaniments and numbers. This switch also allows our churches to grow closer together by sharing the best parts of each of their music programs in one, unified resource. Questions about this transition are natural, so here are answers to some of the most common:

Does this mean we'll never use the hymnals in our pews again?

No. Churches with hardbound hymnals will continue to use their books for the weekly readings. Churches that use a Missalette will use a readings-only Missalette for weekly readings.

Aren't worship aids expensive to print every week?

No. The decision to transition to worship aids comes after a careful study of the cost-benefit analysis of each music resource option. Worship aids will save OLF thousands of dollars each year over a yearly Missalette subscription or the investment cost of a hardbound hymnal.

Are the hymnals at each church really that different?

Yes! There are substantial differences between the four hymnals used in each of Our Lady of Fatima's churches. Not only are different sets of songs included in each book, but major changes that exist between each edition. Even classics like "Immaculate Mary" can have anywhere from four to seven verses depending on the hymnal. This coupled with a completely different organ part for each hymn means a lot of juggling for our rotating musicians. The 7:30 a.m. Mass at St. Teresa and the 11:30 a.m. Mass at St. Patrick will not need worship aids at this time, since resources will still be in the pews to support the musicians of those Masses.

I still don't understand why we're making this change...

An important goal of the Beacons of Light process is the unification of OLF's staff and programs. Part of this goal means sharing our musicians between churches. By transitioning to one unified resource for hymns, we alleviate a great deal of confusion for our musicians. Now, organists and choirs can know what to expect when they serve at Masses, concerts, special events, weddings and funerals in OLF.

What do I do with the Worship aid at the end of Mass?

So that subsequent Masses may use the worship aids and so to alleviate clean up for our ushers, please return them near the door as you exit.






