Schedule at least nine months in advance. Preparation program and parish registration is required.

Those weakened by age, afflicted by serious illness or preparing for serious surgery should receive this sacrament.

HOMEBOUND

Extraordinary Ministers can be arranged to visit homes and nursing facilities with the Eucharist for those unable to worship on Sundays.

MENTAL WELLNESS FOR THE FAITHFUL

"How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen!"

Wow. You can really feel the weight of this plea. I bet most of us have been there at one time or another. Appealing to God or someone to see me and hear me, awaiting a response, only to hear nothing, to feel nothing and see nothing. Isolation. Alone. Empty. This is an awful experience. None of us long to feel that. In fact, we all greatly dislike it. That's universal. Yet, how many of us truly and vulnerably reveal this to the Lord or to another? This aloneness. This emptiness. Jesus asks us to come to Him with our whole hearts. He may even yearn for us, in these moments, to bring this pain vulnerably to Him. For it is in this risk of being vulnerable with Him, being truly open with Him about our pain, that we might finally open ourselves to the reality of allowing Him to be the God of our lives and no longer the self sufficient Gods that Satan has invited us to be since the fall. And it is in that vulnerability where, "The Lord answered me," and we can be comforted in knowing, "The vision has its time...to fulfillment, and will not disappoint." Come and see.

CATHOLICISM EXPLAINED

GOSSIP: RIGHTING ONE MORE THING | CONTRIBUTED BY: Fr. Isaiah Callan

I remember back to high school, when gossip seemed fashionable or even necessary to the full high school experience. It often took on a life of its own and was always a good friend of "the Drama," if not its source. In the end, was anyone better off knowing? Many of us wake up in the morning without looking to spread gossip about those we hate or love. And yet, how often have we found ourselves having said "too little" about anything else? Gossip is known by many names. Calumny, slander, detraction, backbiting or back-stabbing, tale-bearing or whispering – all refer to variations of this more behind-the-scenes sin. Its subtlety sometimes allows it to flourish and almost be fashionable. As a rite of passage or a pastime in some social settings, it's not hard to imagine or recall the allure of joining the "guys" or "girls" in a school hallway, at work when on a break, on the warehouse floor waiting between deliveries, or in the supermarket aisle with a couple of friends. Gossip can also infect one-on-one encounters, from the security of our home to the bleachers at a sports game. Gossip can occur with the fewest people possible or with the biggest of crowds, in private or in public.

Whether the type of gossip is more overt or secret, they violate the good reputation to which every man has a right. And this is a serious issue. It is the duty of every person to secure the right to a good reputation for the other. We all want a good reputation, and conversely, the privacy necessary to grow that which comes with it. We might then ask, is there any way to reveal someone's shortcomings in charity and truth? Yes, the kryptonite of gossip will reveal the way forward to us. For now it is important to note that the spirit and context in which we share information matters and tracking it briefly in our own lives can make all the difference on the road to long-term virtuous connection.

Oftentimes, conversations start out innocent enough with a comment or two about the weather and some true insights about the difficulty of work or a relationship. Small talk and commiseration lead to connection, and then, bolstered by a few moments of this, we share all information acting as if that is the source of relational depth. Before we know it, we have gone from talking in such a way as to reveal who others are to talking about who they are not. The priest, St. Francis de Sales, once gave a penitent the penance to rip open a feather pillow at the top of a church steeple and then see if they could retrieve all the feathers. As you might expect, it was a nearly impossible task but a powerful image of how widespread the effect of language can have in the world. It is not impossible for us to solve the problem. We need only cut open fewer pillows, metaphorically speaking.

Instead of killing good reputations, let us kill gossip. It is surprisingly easy. Only saying or writing that which is **TRUE, KIND** (upbuilding/upright), and **NECESSARY** will help us find true connection and discover even more of it. We can filter what is to be said to the right audience and when we can't avoid gossip, we need not entertain it. We can pray for those who are speaking or listening to the gossip, or we can courageously combat it with a question about the nature of any conversation, with more assertive statements to follow, if necessary. Even though we may falter, we now know how to abstain from writing or saying an unhelpful word. We now know how to "right" one more thing.

WORLD MISSION MONTH: UNITED IN PRAYER WITH THE MISSIONS

As World Mission Month continues, we are invited not only to give but to pray for the Church in mission territories.

One powerful way to do this is by praying the **World Mission Rosary,** introduced by Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen in 1951.

Each decade is a different color, representing a region of the world.

In *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, St. Pope Paul VI reminds us that prayer is the soul of all mission: "It is the Holy Spirit who, today just as at the beginning of the Church, acts in every evangelizer" (75). Through our prayers, we unite ourselves with missionaries bringing the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Let us offer our Rosaries and Masses this week for those who bring Christ's love to the margins, often at great personal cost. And let us ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle the fire of hope in our own hearts, that we may also be missionaries, wherever we are.




