

MATRIMONY

Schedule at least nine months in advance. Preparation program and parish registration is required.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Those weakened by age, afflicted by serious illness or preparing for serious surgery should receive this sacrament.

HOMEBOUND

Extraordinary Ministers can be arranged to visit homes and nursing facilities with the Eucharist for those unable to worship on Sundays.

SAFEPARISH

To volunteer with children within Our Lady of Fatima, you must be Archdiocesan-compliant and registered with the SafeParish program.

ST. PATRICK CATHOLIC CHURCH CAPITAL PROJECT



PHASE II - CHURCH FRONT | NOVEMBER 2025

More than a dozen years ago, the snow melt system within St. Patrick Catholic Church's front steps began to fail, causing slipping hazards and additional maintenance work and concerns. In combination with the inconsistent step heights and cracks, this deferred maintenance project was also requested as a necessary capital repair during the 2019 St. Patrick listening session, when parishioners shared their feedback.

Finance Council voted to approve the project, and, although not a voting entity, Fr. Eric met with Pastoral Council to inform and discuss the need. The Archbishop of Cincinnati has signed the necessary documentation. Planning meetings have occurred and touch bases will be ongoing. Phase II is estimated to cost approximately \$250K. The Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC) that St. Patrick received in May 2025 has now blessed us to move forward with Phase II of St. Patrick's Capital Project immediately.

St. Patrick is pleased to work with Will-Con as contractor for this Phase, owned by Kris Williams, parishioner. In preparation of construction, Will-Con will install temporary fencing in the front. The Crawford Street-side church door (near the cry room), will be repaired and operable for Masses. This door will be used in addition to the existing handicap ramp door. Exits will be reviewed for fire code safety. Proper permits are pending for road and sidewalk closure, as well.

Weather-permitting, the goal for Phase II completion will be two to three months. Phase II includes:

- New heated front steps will be installed. A 4,000 PSI concrete will be used. The snow melt
 system will be capable to melt 4" inches of snow an hour. Natural gas boilers, turned on and off
 by snow and ice sensors, will be embedded into the concrete, alleviating slipping hazards and
 maintenance frequency. Salt-inhibitor concrete will be used on the steps only to reduce
 deterioration of the concrete when any salt is used.
- The new, white concrete will house 6-foot landings with three steps in between each landing.
 The landings will not only allow parishioners a moment of reprieve if needed, photography
 opportunities for weddings, but primarily, it will allow for smoother navigation into church
 with caskets.
- The entrance and steps will now be up to building code for the height of the steps. Previous
 heights were between 4.5 and 8.75,' having no consistency. The new steps will be 7.5," and there
 will be zero-entry into the front doors (no step up).
- The **hand railings** were too low and wobbly and will be replaced at the proper height.
- The Southwest sidewalk from Crawford to the front church walkway towards the handicap ramp base will be Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant.
- The Southwest corner grass will be regraded to suit the new concrete with reseeded grass. It
 will be ADA compliant from the Southwest corner, across the front to the existing handicap
 access ramp.

Vigil and Sunday Mass ushers should please be stationed at the ramp door and the Crawford Street door upon entrance and exit from Mass. Weekday Sacristans and weekend ushers will receive further communication about door un/locking.




