Latin and the Mass

As Advent returns, we will once again sing Mass parts in Latin, including the "Holy, Holy" and "Lamb of God." Every year, this change brings up a few questions, most commonly, "Why are we singing in Latin," and, "Are we allowed to do this," and "Didn't Vatican II get rid of Latin?"

To explain why we use Latin in the Catholic Church, let's begin with what Vatican II is. Vatican II, or the Second Vatican Council, was an ecumenical council of the Roman Catholic Church from 1962 to 1965. At an ecumenical council, all the bishops of the world are called together by the pope in order to meet and listen to the voice of God in the Holy Spirit.

At ecumenical councils, under the direction of the Holy Spirit, the bishops define either dogma (what we believe) or discipline (how we live out our beliefs). Ecumenical councils are rare - only 21 have occurred in the entire history of the Church - and they have defined some of our most important practices and beliefs. Examples include the Nicene Creed and the belief that Mary is the Mother of God.

The decrees of an ecumenical council are "binding for all Christians" and are understood to be "infallible," meaning they are communicated directly from God to His people without error.

Did Vatican II get rid of Latin? While the council made significant reforms to the Catholic liturgy, it did not get rid of Latin. Instead, Vatican II affirmed the place of Latin in the Roman Catholic Church while allowing the use of the vernacular (language of the people) during Mass. Of Latin, Vatican II says:

"...the use of the Latin language is to be preserved..." and "...steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts...[of the] Mass which pertain to them." Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy: Sacrosanctum Concilium, 1963, nos. 36.1, 54

For some, using Latin in church may feel like moving backwards in time. For others, it may feel unfamiliar or intimidating. But using Latin does not move us backward, nor is it meant to make people uncomfortable. Instead, it connects us more deeply with the church of Jesus Christ. By using Latin, we connect with the global Body of Christ through the universal language, that, through the centuries, has avoided favoring any single modern culture or nation, and it has helped maintain the integrity of the faith across time and regions. We root ourselves in the traditions that have sustained our Church for thousands of years.

This Advent, I invite you to sing in Latin, even if it feels a bit unusual at first. We are taking part in something greater than any one of us, individually.



CHRIST IN THE WOMB

Week 36 – Jesus is developing increased coordination this week. He has begun holding and grasping things in His little hands, things like His ears, His knees and even His umbilical cord once or twice. *Jesus of the womb, Hear our prayers!*

MENTAL WELLNESS FOR THE FAITHFUL

Peace be with you. "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." In the 13th Century, St. Thomas Aquinas worked on a pile of works known as his "Summa Theologica" – a summary of theology. In the "Summa," St. Thomas identifies various Godly truths which are determined by placing a question forth and logically determining answers through process of elimination and reasoning. For even experienced students, the Summa can be challenging to read. Yet, it has had a profound impact on the Church and how we understand our relationship with God, how we view Him and how we believe He views us. One section of the Summa that fascinates me, especially as a therapist, is question #38: The remedies of sorrow and pain. In this question, St. Thomas identifies five remedies for distress and sorrow: pleasure, weeping, sympathy of friends, contemplating truth and taking a bath or sleeping. The next bulletin entries will focus on these very practical tips and how we can use them to persevere during challenging times towards securing our loves, as Jesus tells us in today's Gospel. However, I bet you are already beginning to think about how you can use these tips from St. Thomas to navigate challenging times in your life simply by giving yourself the permission to do these things. Afterall, St. Thomas is a Doctor, so we can do what the Doctor ordered, right? Persevere my brothers and sisters, for God is with us always. Come and see.




NOVEMBER 23: FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING




